## <u>PSHE</u>

Year 7 students receive two sessions of PSHE per week, in Year 7 our PSHE topics are:

- Visions and Values, life as a Cannock Chase High School Student;
- Bullying / Online Bullying;
- Internet Safety / Social Media Awareness;
- Mental Health Awareness;
- Road / Rail / Water Safety;
- Introduction to careers;
- Citizenship Charity Projects.

Alongside our PSHE curriculum, Year 7 will also take part in off timetable days for the following events:

- Remembrance Service;
- Carol Service;
- Holocaust Memorial Day;
- World Book Day;

As part of our Year 7 PSHE scheme of work, Year 7 will be focusing on the role of Citizenship, both on a local and global scale. We would like to tell you about two charities that Year 7 will be planning and raising money for in school.
