UNIFORM & EQUIPMENT POLICY

This Policy applies to Years 7 to 13.

Our Uniform Policy is in line with our commitment to the highest standards of student dress, as we prepare all of our students for the world of work and beyond.

Our Policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- Enhances and strengthens a feeling of community and belonging;
- Is practical and smart;
- Identifies our students as part of our school;
- Is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- Makes students feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance and financial circumstances.

Our intention is that our school uniform continues to be as reasonably priced as possible for parents avoiding expensive fashion items/trends.

We ask that all parents/carers refer to this Policy before purchasing any items, as inappropriate school uniform will need to then be replaced. If parents/carers are in any doubt about what is/is not permitted, please check with the school beforehand. Displays of what is regarded as correct school uniform are available for parents to view in the lower school reception area.

The support of all parents in ensuring that our clear Uniform Policy is adhered to at all times is appreciated. We would ask that all uniform is clearly labelled in case any items are misplaced.

School Uniform Years 7 to 11

Blazer Black with red trim and school badge/Prefects – grey blazer with red trim and school

badge.

Trousers Smart, tailored, black trousers, full length, straight legged. (Leggings, lycra based,

Chinos or denim are not acceptable). Tailored black shorts (lycra based, denim and

cargo shorts are not acceptable).

Shirt White short or long sleeve, collars to be buttoned and shirts tucked in.

Sweater Sweaters are optional but, if worn, should be plain black V neck with no logo.

Tie Available from school and local retailers.

Shoes Black formal traditional footwear – leather look **ONLY**.

(Trainers, canvas pumps/leisure shoes/Crocs and any form of footwear with a sports

label are not acceptable e.g. Converse/Vans/Nike/Adidas/Lacoste).

Socks Plain black (trainer socks are not permitted). Ankles should not be visible.Coat Denim or leather is not allowed. Hoodies and tracksuit tops are not allowed.

Jewellery Students are allowed to wear one small stud in the <u>lower lobe</u> of each ear only. <u>No other form of jewellery</u> is allowed apart from a wrist watch. No other piercings are permitted. Clear retainers are acceptable for other piercings.

Hair Hairstyles should be neat and presentable and in keeping with the ethos of our community. (Grade 1 cut all over is not permitted and hair should be free from tramlines and other patterns). Hair colour should be of a natural colour only.

Additional guidance regarding boys' uniform

Facial hair should be trimmed and smart.

<u>Girls</u>

Blazer Black with red trim and school badge/Prefects – grey blazer with red trim and school

badge.

Skirt Plain black pleated skirt only worn just above knee level. (Lycra figure hugging skirts are

not acceptable) Skirts should not be rolled up.

Trousers Smart, black trousers, full length (no ankles on show). (Figure hugging trousers,

leggings, jeggings, chinos or denim are not acceptable).

Shirt White. Plain, short or long sleeve. Collars to be buttoned and shirts tucked in. **Fashion**

style blouses without a formal collar are not acceptable.

Sweater Sweaters are optional but, if worn, should be plain black V neck with no logo.

Tie Available from school and local retailers.

Shoes Black formal traditional leather shoe **ONLY**. Maximum heel one inch.

(Trainers, canvas pumps/leisure shoes/Crocs, and any form of footwear with a sports label are not acceptable e.g. Converse/Vans/Nike). Plain black leather (look) ankle

boots can be worn with both trousers and skirts.

Socks Plain black (trainer socks are not permitted). Ankles should not be visible.

(Tights may be worn, however, these must be plain black/nude with no extreme

patterns.)

Coat Denim or leather is not allowed. **Hoodies and tracksuit tops are not allowed.**

Jewellery Students are allowed to wear one small stud in the <u>lower lobe</u> of each ear only. <u>No</u>

other form of jewellery is allowed apart from a wrist watch. Rings and bracelets are not

permitted. Clear retainers are acceptable for other piercings.

Hair Hairstyles should be neat and presentable and in keeping with the ethos of our

community. Hair colour should be of a natural colour only.

Additional guidance regarding uniform

- Any further piercings should be replaced with a retainer; plasters will not be accepted as a way of covering a piercing.
- Tattoos are not acceptable.
- In Years 7-11, students are allowed discreet mascara and natural coloured foundation. Eyebrows should be natural with no makeup products applied under any circumstances. If a student presents themselves as wearing excessive makeup, they will be asked to remove it by the Director of Year.
- Fake nails are not to be worn for health and safety reasons. Students are permitted to wear nail varnish but this must be clear ONLY, students will be asked to remove inappropriate nail varnish.
- Fake eyelashes are not acceptable. No shaven eyebrows or tramlines.
- Blazers must be worn at all times, both in lessons and in corridors. If a student wishes to remove their blazer during the lesson, they are to ask the teaching member of staff politely.

- The Headteacher will authorise 'no blazer days' in extremes of heat. Outdoor coats must be removed when entering classrooms and assemblies.
- Hairstyles worn because of cultural, family or social customs, with certain hairstyles adopted
 for racial or religious grounds are acceptable. This includes hairstyles such as (but not
 limited to) braids, locks, twists, cornrows, plaits, natural Afro hairstyles and head coverings,
 including religious based head coverings and African heritage head wraps.
- The Headteacher has the final decision in matters relating to uniform and appearance.
- If a student is not in correct full school uniform they will either be:
 - Sent home to change if we are able to contact parents/guardians;
 - O Able to borrow clean spare uniform from school;
 - Placed in isolation until their uniform is correct.
- Red Cards will be issued on a daily basis to address minor uniform infringements. When a student is issued with four red cards within a week, they will be issued with a C3 Red Card detention which will last for forty minutes.

<u>Footwear</u> – Pure black leather look shoe or boot. Pure black ankle boots will be allowed if worn under trousers only.

School Skirts

School skirts should be worn a just above knee level so please ensure that you purchase a suitable skirt where you allow for growth of your child during the academic year.

Sports Kit (Boys & Girls)

- Cannock Chase PE red polo shirt
- Cannock Chase black shorts
- Black socks
- Red jacket (optional a **plain** black round neck jumper may be worn in replacement - No logos.)
- Plain black tracksuit bottoms (no logos or stripes) may also be worn.
- Plain black sports leggings are acceptable with no logos or stripes).

Shin Pads and Gum Shields are needed for activities such as rugby, football, and hockey. Football Boots are needed for football and rugby. Trainers will be required for all other activities

Watches and earrings must be removed for all sporting activities.

All PE items need to be labelled with the student's name.

For any student who forgets their kit, the PE department hold a stock of clean kit that students must wear without argument. If a student is not physically taking part in PE due to injury they are still required to bring and wear their PE kit.

Equipment

All students in Years 7-11 will need the following equipment:

•	Reading book;	•	Ruler (
•	Water bottle;	•	Rubbe

- Pencil case;
- Two black pens;
- At least one pencil;
- A mini whiteboard and two whiteboard pens;
- (15cm in length);
- Rubber;
- Green Pen;
- Calculator (Casio fx 83 GTX or Casio fx 85 GTX only);
- A highlighter.

Other items such as glue and colouring crayons are encouraged, however, scissors and pencil sharpeners will be provided at school and should not be carried. Pencil cases must be placed on the student's desk at the start of every lesson. When a student forgets their pencil case they will be issued with a Red card equipment detention.

Please note: Clean trainers will be required for Drama lessons.



School Bags

All students in Years 7-11 will need to have a suitable school bag with them daily to carry their books and equipment. These bags must be able to accommodate an A4 folder, A4 exercise books and all other equipment.



Inappropriate bags

Small handbags are **not** suitable for school.

School Uniform Years 12 to 13

All CCHS Sixth Form students are expected to wear professional dress five days a week. We have been specific with the language of 'professional' as we do feel that expecting all students to wear suits/business dress would be an inappropriate policy given that many of our students may progress to alternative industries, such as sports, creative or care.

The dress code outlined below hopes to adopt a consistent standard of professional dress, whilst allowing students an appropriate level of individual expression.

"The way you look directly affects the way you think, feel, and act [...]. When you dress down, you sit down – the couch potato trend. Manners break down, you begin to feel down, and you're not as effective" (Kaplan-Leiserson, 2000, p. 39)

MALE DRESS CODE

- **Shirt with collar**. T-shirts and polo shirts are not acceptable.
- **Tie**. Bow ties are acceptable.
- Trousers should be tailored. No jeans, tracksuit bottoms or shorts.
- Formal shoes, though not necessarily black. Trainers, pumps, canvas shoes are not acceptable.
- Smart jacket or blazer. (optional)
- Smart jumper (optional).

FEMALE DRESS CODE

- Skirt, tailored trousers or formal dress.
 Skirts and dresses should be of a suitable length (a minimum length of just above the knee). No jeans, tracksuit bottoms, leggings or shorts. No leggings please.
 Lycra skirts are not allowed.
- Blouse, shirt or tailored top. Tops that reveal the abdomen or chest are not acceptable, as are strapless or backless tops. Students should have their shoulders covered.
- Formal shoes or boots (not above the calf), though not necessarily black. Trainers, pumps, canvas shoes or flip-flops are not acceptable. Doc-Martin style shoes can be worn underneath trousers. Heels should be an appropriate height (maximum of 2.5 inches).
- Smart jacket or blazer. (optional)

Denim clothing in any form is not acceptable.

Subjects with Specialist Dress Codes

If a student studies a subject that requires different dress, including Sport, Drama, Dance, etc, students are expected to change for this lesson when necessary, following the subject-specific policy, and then change back to professional dress.

Hair, Make-Up, Jewellery & Tattoos

Hair should be in a neat, professional style and of a natural colour (dying is acceptable but radical colours are not appropriate). Make-up should be discreet. Tattoos must be covered. Small amounts of jewellery are acceptable, including costume jewellery. Loose items, such as hoop earrings, are not appropriate for health and safety reasons. Piercings must be discreet, with no more than one piercing in each ear and no facial/tongue piercings, or ear spacers. A small clear stud in the nose is allowed. Any other piercings should be replaced with a clear retainer.

It remains the right of senior members of staff to determine whether a particular item of dress is or is not appropriate for Sixth Form. Students who arrive to Sixth Form inappropriately dressed will be sent home to change.
