The new government statuary requirements have made the teaching of Relationship and Sex Education compulsory in primary and secondary schools across the country. Sex education within the national curriculum of Science (including teaching about reproduction in humans) is also compulsory. However, parents and carers have the right to withdraw their child from aspects of sex education within PSHE up until 3 terms prior to their child's 16th birthday. RSE is part of our school's PSHE education programme which is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body.
